

Roger S. Smith Undergraduate Summer Research Award, funded in partnership with Killam

Information for Students

Are you interested in:

- gaining research experience this summer
- acquiring valuable skills and experience
- working closely with a faculty mentor (supervisor) in a research capacity
- looking for a project to develop into an Honours Thesis (NS 498)
- exploring future career possibilities in a research environment

This award could be for you!

Apply for a Roger S. Smith Undergraduate Summer Research Award with the Faculty of Native Studies.

What does the Roger S. Smith Undergraduate Summer Research Award entail?

This award is intended to cultivate and support research collaboration between undergraduate students and faculty members. This award is an opportunity to conduct research and receive **\$6,000** to cover 15 weeks of full-time (normally May-August) research-based activity this summer. Your research efforts are not limited to collecting data or writing a literature review, but will result in a final product, such as: a paper, a data base, a memorandum, or a poster.

Proposed activities might either

- (1) be a topic that the award holder (student) has designed; or
- (2) contribute to a faculty supervisor's existing research project.

This award is not a job, but an internship with benefits.

How many awards will be made?

One or two awards are available annually. A faculty member can only mentor one student award holder at a time. An undergraduate student can only hold a Roger S. Smith Undergraduate Summer Research Award once.

Who is eligible to apply?

To be eligible, you must meet <u>all</u> of these requirements:

- Senior undergraduate student
- Currently enrolled in the Faculty and continuing in a Native Studies program in 2023/24
- Minimum Faculty GPA of 3.3
- Entitled to work on campus

How do I apply?

1. Begin by meeting with a potential faculty supervisor.

- 2. Complete the *student portion* of the **application form**.
- 3. Ask your supervisor to complete the *supervisor portion* of the application. Faculty supervisors must sign application forms **before** submission. By signing your form, the faculty supervisor is expressing a willingness to supervise the work and is committing to serve as an active

mentor. While you can obtain input from a faculty advisor, the student must write the proposal.

- 4. Submit a completed application form, along with your resume, to the Faculty of Native Studies before the deadline.
- 5. Community engagement should be prioritized.

When is the deadline for applications?

Applications must be received by Friday, 14 April 2023.

Award winners will be notified by Friday, 21 April 2023.

Applicants are advised to speak to a faculty supervisor well in advance of the application deadline.

How do I start?

After downloading the application form, approach a Faculty of Native Studies professor involved in research and discuss the possibilities of research under the auspices of the Roger S. Smith Undergraduate Summer Research Award. The extent and quality of the mentoring will influence the success of the experience and the research outcome.

What are the criteria used to evaluate projects applications?

The following criteria will be used to assess the application:

- the ability to show a strong grasp of the field being studied as well as a commitment to community engagement
- the supervising professor engagement and commitment to research
- the project's learning potential
- the specific skills and experience the student will gain from the project
- the fit of the project with the applicant's academic program
- the applicant's Native Studies GPA
- the ability to articulate your own thoughts in a concise and persuasive manner.

Preference will be given to projects structured as internships assisting students in gaining specific research skills and experience.

Incomplete or late applications will not be accepted.
